

Located close to the center of Ann Arbor, the land surrounding Argo Pond has long been a prime recreation area and natural retreat for the citizens of Ann Arbor.

As part of a multi-firm design team, the Johnson Hill Land Ethics Studio developed plans for linking the Argo Park area into the network of park trails along the Huron River in Ann Arbor, Michigan. Conceptual recommendations were provided for connecting boardwalks and trails within the Argo Pond Area.

These recommendations led to subsequent improvements at Bandemer Park and the construction of an extensive boardwalk along Barton Drive by the City of Ann Arbor. The original study, completed in 1993, incorporated the results from an extensive series of public sessions and meetings.

The Argo trail and boardwalk are now part of a larger trail loop around Argo Pond that is one of the most heavily used paths in the city. Eventually, plans call for the Argo Trail to be an integrated part of the larger Huron River Greenway.
