

The Grand River waterfront is an unparalleled cultural, historic, natural, and economic resource for the City of Grand Haven.

The goal of the City of Grand Haven's Waterfront Strategic Plan is to provide a guide to City officials in evaluating proposed public and private development initiatives along the Waterfront in Downtown Grand Haven, to inform and guide Waterfront property owners, prospective property owners, and developers about what is likely to be approved by the Planning Commission and City Council, and to fulfill a voiced need by participants in both the physical and economic development processes for clear and transparent Downtown development goals and guidelines.

The Waterfront Strategic Plan builds upon the concepts defined in the Grand Haven Downtown Vision Plan. This plan serves as the catalyst for redevelopment throughout downtown Grand Haven and several projects have been completed since the plan was adopted in early 2005.
